

Venue Summer PhD School Mont-Soleil 2018



How to get there

Mont-Soleil is located above the city of Saint-Imier in the Western part of Switzerland.

General information on Mont-Soleil and its surroundings about transportation, accommodation, attractions etc. is available, for example, at the tourism office of the Bernese Jura (see www.jurabernois.ch/en).

Please note that applicants from Non-EU countries may need a valid Visa for entering Switzerland. Please contact the Swiss Embassy in your country to check it.

Mont-Soleil can easily be reached by public transport. Both international airports in Zurich and Geneva have their own train station. The Swiss Federal Railways provide an easy to use journey planner for the public transport in Switzerland (see www.sbb.ch/en/timetable.html).

When using the car, please note that there is a driving ban on the 400 m long access path to the power station on Mont-Soleil, so that you have to leave your car at the parking lot along the Mont-Soleil pass road.

Local transports

Local transports on Mont-Soleil from lodging to the Mont-Soleil Conference center and back, transports during evening events are done by minibus. It is included in the convenience package.
